Exodus 12:1-42

Big Idea: *God has made a way for us to be delivered from his wrath and judgment.*

Remember

From the sermon on Sunday, what were some things that stood out to you?

Recall the narrative of what happened in Exodus 12. Can you imagine the mourning of the people of Egypt?

Deepen -

In Exodus 12:14 - The Passover was instituted as a “memorial day.” What would have been some of the things each year that the people of Israel were to remember?

How is this similar to the institution of the Lords Supper?

In 1 Corinthians 5:7 Jesus is referred to as our Passover lamb.

Matthew 26:2 - Jesus death was happening in line with the Jewish celebration of Passover.

Read 1 Corinthians 11:23-26

Remembering what God did in the Passover was both a heavy thing (killing the first-borns of all of Egypt) and something to celebrate (God’s severe wrath paved the way for the exodus from Egypt.) God set up the Passover to help the people remember what he had done for them.

What are some things that you personally remember when you approach the table on Sundays? What are some things that you were personally delivered from?

Have you ever become numb to the reality of Christ Death sacrifice and what this means to your life?

How do we keep his severe justice and mercy displayed in Christ’s death and resurrection fresh as we take the Lord’s table?

Transform:

What are some things in your life that keep you from experiencing fully the reality of Christ’s work on the cross?

For the Israelites who were now delivered the Passover was reinforced by a current reality that they were no longer in Egypt. For us The reality of the Gospel should not only be something we remember but a daily experience.

How should our remembrance of the Gospel effect us daily? What are some areas in your daily life that need repentance in order to reflect the gospel in your life?

1 Corinthians 11:26 says that as often as you take the table you “proclaim the Lord’s death...” How does taking the Lord’s table proclaim Christ’s death?

How does our daily remembrance of Christ help you proclaim his death and resurrection?
