Deepen

What was God doing for his people in this passage?

When God set the people free from Egypt was the freedom absent from a master?

How does this resemble the New Testament process of redemption?

What are some examples of God redeeming a people for Himself? What are examples of boundaries and exhortations God gave to his people that He has set free?

- *Ephesians 5:1-5 - Be imitators of God who has gave himself for us.*
- *Galatians 5:13-17 - Don't use freedom for your flesh*
- *1 Peter 2:9-11- We are chosen therefore abstain from the passions -*

Why is it tempting to use our freedom as an opportunity for sin?

Transform

What are some ways that we see Israel use God's deliverance for sin rather than worship?

Are their areas where you have used your "freedom" for an opportunity for Sin?

God was redeeming a people for himself. They had seen him as savior and in these passages God was setting himself up as their Lord and master. It is important for us to see Christ as both our savior and Lord. If we are unbalanced in our understanding of Jesus as savior and lord -how does it affect our lives being on mission for Christ?

Where in your life do you see Christ as "savior" but ignore him as "Lord"?
