**Deepen**

**Read Matthew 28:16-20**

Why is it important to remember that having a gospel identity and living in community are a part of the mission to which we are called?

Why is it important to remember that worship of Jesus is our fuel for mission?

Why must we remember the grandness of the mission? *Remember this quote, "It is not so much the case that God has a mission for his church in the world, as that God has a church for his mission in the world. Mission was not made for the church; the church was made for mission – God's mission."* –Chris Wright (*The Mission of God's People*) You can reference the chart at the bottom of this page as well to think through the grandness of God's mission that we are a part of?

David mentioned we have a tendency to have a reductionist view of making disciples. What are some ways we are tempted to have a reductionist view of what it means to makes disciples?

The imperative (or command) in this passage is "make disciples". How does your view of this imperative change as you remember how that fits as a part of the grand mission of God?

**Transform**

Are you a disciple of Jesus?

Are we active participants in the redemptive mission of God?

Are disciples being made at Exodus? In your CG? *Talk through some of the people God has saved and changed as a part of our church and talk about the hundreds and thousands in our communities that do not yet know Christ.*

Do you see yourself as a missionary and a disciple maker in the church?

Do we have a global view of the mission?

*“The church must be seen as the company of pilgrims on the way to the end of the world and the ends of the earth.” –Leslie Newbigin*

Are you walking in the power and promise of Jesus? How do you need to repent of trying to walk in your own strength and story?

Close your time praying and asking Jesus that we would play our roles well in the mission He has called us to? Pray for other church plants we support. Pray for the global mission of God...including the Echelon team in the South Sudan.

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
