What stands out to you from the passage? What was particularly helpful from the sermon?

Deepen

Compare the following from Leviticus and Hebrews.

- Hebrews 9:24-28

Why do Christians sometimes not fully trust the finality of Jesus' work in our place?

How can we live into the reality of our guilt and shame being removed in Jesus?

Transform

Read Hebrews 10:19-25

The "therefore" of v. 19 is calling us to live out the implications of Jesus' all sufficient sacrifice.

- What are some responsibilities?

- Enjoying the Presence of Jesus
- Holding fast to the Confession of our hope
- Considering how to stir up one another
