## Remember

- If your group doesn't seem to think that they have met anyone new, engage that with grace. Remind the group to own the 10 feet around them every Sunday. And make a note to remind them during the week.

What stood out to you from the sermon? What encouraged you? What challenged you?

## **Deepen**

In John 4, Jesus engages the cultural categories of ethnicity, religion and gender. What do we learn from him? How might we apply that in our lives today?

As Jesus engages the woman about spiritual matters, what stands out to you?

- How does he address her sin and shame?
- How does he address her questions?

Brian connected this passage to Jeremiah 2:12-13. Read and discuss.

- Why would Jeremiah call the heavens to be appalled at v. 13?
- Why are the false wells in our lives so appealing?
- What are some idols that God is calling you to repent of?

In John 4, this woman describes Jesus as one who knew everything I ever did. Why would that be good news?

## **Transform**

When the disciples return in vv. 31-38, Jesus turns the lesson from personal repentance to missional engagement. He describes the fields as white and ready for harvest. Do you view the world in this way? Why or why not?

Jesus describes different roles in the harvest. How might we live this out?

- As individuals?
- In our families?
- As a community group?

Who are some people you are investing in today as you pray for the harvest of Jesus?
